1. Project or Service Name: Training for Community Professionals

Project Description:

The SKCCN Board will continue it's efforts to support an Annual Children's Domestic Violence Conference. We will work in collaboration with Public Health – Seattle & King County, the University of Washington, YWCA, Eastside Domestic Violence Programs, Domestic Abuse Women's Network, Children's Hospital, elected officials and others to organize two conferences during the biennium in March of 2008 and 2009. After the 2006 event conference organizers identified several obstacles if this conference was to continue – both organizational and financial. The SKCCN has agreed to take a leading role in order to assure continuation and growth. We will act as one of two partners that lead the organizational effort and provide services as fiscal agent using our 501(c)(3) status. This will require additional staff time to:

- Site – The SKCCN will take the lead role in researching and choosing an appropriate site that fits within the projected budget. This will include arrangements for computers, projectors, audio visual, signage, refreshments, and all other logistics for the conference.
- Speakers – The SKCCN will work with the committee to recruit national and local speakers. As fiscal agent we will handle the details of contracts, payment, hotel, travel and other needs handle the needs for speakers
- Participants – The SKCCN will take responsibility for registrations including the tasks of tracking breakout signups, meals etc.
- Finances – The SKCCN will handle all funds through the non-profit and allow organizers to use the 501(c)(3) status to secure donations that will allow for scholarships to the conference.

The projected audience for the conferences will continue to include domestic violence advocates, DV service providers, Child Protective Services, mental health providers, law enforcement, DV Prosecutors and victims. The conference will continue to bring nationally accredited speakers and service providers to King County to provide specific information on issues including: custody and visitation, community/law enforcement response to domestic violence, therapeutic interventions and CPS alternate responses to Domestic Violence. Our goal is to keep registration fees to a minimum in an effort to make sure we will continue to attract up to 500 participants each year.

Measurable Result: Short-term child and family result/outcome means a measurable change in the knowledge, skills, attitude, behavior, or status of a child or family that can be expected to occur within one to two years, and with sufficient scale and duration, may be logically related to a long term result; or Community Result means a change in the skills, practices, awareness, and/or response to human needs on the part of service providers, policy, and other decision makers, systems, organizations, and communities that can be expected to occur within one or two years and with sufficient scale and duration, is expected to lead to long-term results in the lives of children and families.)
